Dear Councilman Bonin,

Westchester Neighbors Association has represents the approximately 6000 residences in zip code 90045

We are aware that efforts to legitimize street vendors has been underway for several years and now we understand that you are seriously considering creating an ordinance to do so.

We oppose this action for several reasons:

- · --unfair competition with our community serving brick and mortar businesses.
- --providing virtually free use of our streets and sidewalks that are paid for by our taxes.
- --carts blocking our limited sidewalk areas.
- --potential liability issues if someone is hurt while frequenting a "legitimized" cart on a public sidewalk or curbside.

Whereas there may be some areas of this large city whose residents who do not mind and even endorse sidewalk stands, we do not. DO NOT AUTHORIZE CARTS IN OUR NEIGHBORHOODS.

Do not assume that this will be a revenue stream for LA. We expect that revenue to the City will be far less than the cost of policing.

Aside from a fairness issue, the City has demonstrated its inability to collect taxes from limited controlled parking lots who deal in cash. We expect nothing better with street carts.
