Roybal Hearing Room 350, City Hall, 200 North Spring Street, Los Angeles, CA 90012, to consider an appeal filed by Ricky Hirschfield of the Richard S. Hirschfield Trust, from the entire determination of the West Los Angeles Area Planning Commission (WLAAPC) in disapproving: 1) a requested zone change from the R2-1 (Two-Family zone) to the RD3-1 (Restricted Density Multiple Dwelling zone) and 2) a zone change from R2-1 (Two-Family zone) to the (T)(Q)RD3-1 (Restricted Density Multiple Dwelling zone) with tentative T conditions and Q conditions, for the proposed construction of four single-family dwellings on property located at 2011 South Barry Avenue. (The WLAAPC also adopted revised Findings, approved the withdrawal of the zone variance request, and did not adopt the Mitigated Negative Declaration.)
