At its regular meeting of March 21, 2014, the Rules, Elections and Intergovernmental Relations Committee considered a CLA report and Resolution relative to the City's position to support raising the public service cap for Community Development Block Grant funds. Further, the CLA report includes a revised Resolution with updated information that also clarifies the City's position on this matter. After consideration and having provided an opportunity for public comment, the Committee recommended that Council adopt the accompanying revised Resolution. RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, any official position of the City of Los Angeles with respect to legislation, rules, regulations, or policies proposed to or pending before a local, state, or federal governmental body or agency must have first been adopted in the form of a Resolution by the City Council with the concurrence of the Mayor; and

WHEREAS, the poverty rate in Los Angeles is higher than any other major American City; and

WHERAS, several poverty programs in Los Angeles are funded through the Consolidated Plan, which includes Community Development Block Grants (CDBG); and

WHEREAS, the City of Los Angeles is limited in the amount of public service activities it can provide with CDBG funds due to a 15 percent public service cap; and

WHEREAS, other large cities, such as Seattle, Baltimore, and Chicago have a higher public service cap and are able to spend a larger percentage of CDBG funds on public service activities; and

WHEREAS, Los Angeles has for several years funded Community Based Development Organizations (CBDO) with CDBG funds through the Consolidated Plan, including FamilySource Centers, Summer Night Lights, and Clean and Green programs; and

WHEREAS, the Housing and Urban Development Department recently issued a letter to inform City of Los Angeles that it was not interpreting CBDO guidelines correctly, and CBDO activities would need to be funded under the public service category which is already at its limit; and

WHEREAS, residents of the City rely on these CBDOs and the CDBG money to receive many public services, and any cuts to these programs will be detrimental to the non-profits and the communities they serve; and

WHEREAS, an increase to the public service cap for Los Angeles' CDBG would ensure that vital services are not lost;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, with the concurrence of the Mayor, that by the adoption of this Resolution, the City of Los Angeles hereby includes in its 2013-2014 Federal Legislative Program SPONSORSHIP and/or SUPPORT of legislation and/or any administrative action that would raise the public service cap Community Development Block Grant funds.
