PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE REPORT relative to the donation of two iRobots and one CINT Commander System and tactical video phone system for use by the Los Angeles Police Department's (LAPD) Metropolitan Division.

Recommendation for Council action:

AUTHORIZE the LAPD to accept the donation of two iRobots and one CINT Commander System and tactical video phone system valued at \$68,194.49 from the Los Angeles Police Foundation for use by the LAPD's Metropolitan Division, and THANK the donor for this generous gift.

<u>Fiscal Impact Statement</u>: None submitted by the LAPD. Neither the City Administrative Officer nor the Chief Legislative Officer has completed a financial analysis of this report.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

SUMMARY

In a report to the Board of Police Commissioners dated September 12, 2014 (attached to the Council file), LAPD requests authority to accept the donation of two iRobots and one CINT Commander System and tactical video phone system. According to LAPD, the CINT Commander System uses wireless technology to capture vital data/recordings during barricaded suspect or hostage-taking incidents. The iRobots will be used to conduct remote interior searches using infra-red cameras. On September 23, 2014, the Board approved the Department's request.

At its meeting held December 12, 2014, the Public Safety Committee recommended that Council authorize LAPD to accept this donation.
