

(1) Technical Proposal Features

We are offering a solution with wireless camera units positioned at four of seven points of interest, as indicated in the map below:



As discussed, the terrain in the area of interest is challenging for wireless networking, since the design should optimize on Line-of-Sight connections as much as possible. We have carefully reviewed the terrain and options to aggregate the signals wirelessly. We identified four locations (in green in drawing) that can be positioned on City of Los Angeles owned light poles, and that can be networked with Line-of-Sight conditions to the Wal-Mart rooftop, which is an existing point within the surveillance system already operational with the Southwest Area Station.


For the remaining locations, we suggest the following alternate approaches, for your review. For C5, already, an existing surveillance camera is available at the apartment complex in that area. One camera particularly is a HD PTZ camera that can be maneuvered to be positioned to the C5 location, and provide / record high quality footage for the area of interest. The Southwest Area Station staff has an existing relationship, and access to this camera.

For C6 and C7, there are various candidate apartment building locations available to place a basic DVR/NVR with a single (fixed) camera to cover the entry point. This can be implemented quite cost-effectively, and is assumed outside of the scope of the project.






In order to reach the C3 and C4 locations, a repeater at Don Cota will be required (blue dot in drawing), again using a City owned pole, per the picture below:



As a further note, for the link from the repeater to the WalMart, some tree branches were found that need to be trimmed to assure proper link conditions. Partly at least, the backyard with trees bordering to Don Tapia in the back was identified as a main issue. See pictures below. We expect these trees can be trimmed in order to clear the path. This effort is not part of CelPlan's offer.







A summary of features is as follows:

- System includes field proven pole camera units that will be positioned next to the
 roadway on light pole or building for the best viewing. It is assumed collaboration
 with City is established to get permits for use of light poles and buildings
 arranged. CelPlan will provide the necessary paperwork for the pole permit
 request process.
- Each pole camera unit features the professional class Axis P1354 fixed megapixel camera. The horizontal resolution of 1280 pixels allows for coverage of 32 ft, with a resolution sufficient to recognize a license plate (assuming 40 pixels/ft). The camera can be positioned in either direction, and is proposed to cover both lanes of the road. The cameras use H.264 encoding which is the most efficient encoding scheme in the industry. The cameras are day/night cameras, and feature advanced settings, such as motion-detection and multi-streaming.
- Using the 4.9 GHz band, a wireless network is established to connect back into the Southwest Camera system. Currently, storage at the central site (police station) only is assumed. In optional scenario, storage will be performed at edge and centrally.
- Motion-detection can be enabled for efficient video recording and network usage.
