

One Page Summary for CF# 14-0163- City Hazardous Waste Operations

Two million tons of hazardous waste are generated in California each year in which the City of Los Angeles contributes eight-seven thousand (87,000) tons or 16%. The Department of Toxic Substances Control one of five departments and boards within Cal –EPA manages hazardous waste. On the local level DTSC oversees the hazardous wastes activities through local agencies. The City has a comprehensive and integrated program for the management of hazardous waste. In the City of Los Angeles three agencies, Bureau of Sanitation, Los Angeles Fire and County Fire regulate the use, storage and disposal of hazardous materials. LASAN uses 5 program elements to manage hazardous waste and the five (5) elements are:


- Residential Special Material Conditionally Exempt Small Quantity Generator (SAFE Centers)
- Abandoned Hazardous Waste Pick-up
- Industrial Wastewater Pre-Treatment Program
- Surveillance Monitoring and Environmental Crimes Task Force
- Management of Hazardous Waste Generated from City Facilities operated by LASAN

LAFD is the City Certified Unified Program Agency (CUPA). The CUPA provides consolidation of hazardous material and waste agency under one agency. The LAFD CUPA program provides

- Hazardous Materials Release Response Plans and Inventory Program (a.k.a. Hazardous Materials Disclosure or "Community-Right-To-Know)
- Underground Storage Tank Program
- Above ground Petroleum Storage Tank Spill Prevention Control and Countermeasure Plan (SPCC)
- Hazardous Waste Generator and Onsite Hazardous Waste Treatment Programs
- California Accidental Release Prevention Program

LA County Fire has an agreement with the City as part of the CUPA program to verify that generators and on site treatment operators are managing their hazardous waste in conformance with State and Federal regulations.
