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PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE REPORT relative to extending the terms of the Fiscal Year (FY) 2012-13 Anti-Human Traffic Task Force Program grant agreement, and the contract with Coalition to Abolish Slavery and Trafficking.

Recommendations for Council action, SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF THE MAYOR:

1. AUTHORIZE the Chief, Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD), or designee, to:
  - a. Accept the no-cost extension for the 2012-13 Anti-Human Trafficking Task Force Program from the State of California Office of Emergency Services (CalOES), extending the grant period from July 1, 2014 to June 30, 2015.
  - b. Execute a Grant Award Amendment on behalf of the City, for the period July 1, 2014 to June 30, 2015, for a sum not to exceed the previously awarded funding amount of \$273,729, subject to the approval of the City Attorney as to form and legality.
  - c. Execute the Third Amendment to Contract No. C-123139 with the Coalition to Abolish Slavery and Trafficking, to extend the term, with no additional funding, to June 30, 2015, subject to the approval of the City Attorney as to form and legality.
  
2. AUTHORIZE the LAPD to:
  - a. Continue to expend the supplemental grant funds in accordance with the grant requirements.
  - b. Submit grant reimbursement requests to the grantor and deposit grant receipts in Police Department Grants Fund No. 399/70.
  - c. Prepare Controller instructions for any technical adjustments, subject to the approval of the City Administrative Officer (CAO); and, AUTHORIZE the Controller to implement the instructions.

Fiscal Impact Statement: The CAO reports that this action will have no fiscal impact inasmuch as the above recommendations extend the term of the 2012-13 Anti-Human Trafficking Task Force Program grant and that of the contract with the Coalition to Abolish Slavery and Trafficking with no changes to previously awarded grant funding. There is no match requirement for the grant and no impact on the General Fund. Acceptance of the supplemental grant and approval of the above recommendations are in compliance with City financial policies in that one-time funds are used for one-time purposes.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

**SUMMARY**

In a report to Council dated December 9, 2014 (attached to the Council file), the CAO states that LAPD requests authority to execute a no-cost time extension for the 2012-13 Anti-Human Trafficking Task Force grant program with CalOES for the period July 1, 2014, to June 30, 2015; and, negotiate and execute a Third Amendment to the contract with the Coalition to Abolish

Slavery and Human Trafficking to extend the term of the contract to June 30, 2015. On August 26, 2014, the Board of Police Commissioners approved LAPD's request for the approval of two program extensions. The CAO substantially concurs with this action, recommending approval of the second grant term extension inasmuch as this first has already been approved.

The CAO reports that the Anti-Human Trafficking Task Force grant program is a statewide program to improve the law enforcement response to all elements of human trafficking and the coordination between responsible agencies to ensure care to victims of human trafficking. LAPD leads the Los Angeles Metropolitan Task Force on Human Trafficking, which also includes the United States Attorney's Office, various other federal and state agencies, and a number of victim and social service organizations. The goals of the Task Force are to identify victims through proactive law enforcement tactics and cooperation; increase the successful prosecution of traffickers through multi-jurisdictional law enforcement cooperation; develop practical service protocols; develop and provide training and support for law enforcement to proactively identify, rescue, and place victims with service providers; and, ensure victim safety and access to needed services.

According to the CAO, Cal OES extended the grant term through June 30, 2015, to provide additional time for grantees to complete program goals.

At its meeting held December 12, 2014, the Public Safety Committee recommended that Council approve the grant and contract term extensions, as recommended by the CAO.
