I support a Wildlife Habitat Linkage Zone ordinance. Los Angeles is not a 450 sq mile homogenous URBAN development. It has a wilderness mountain range dividing the San Fernando Valley that stretches from East LA to Griffith Park to the Pacific Ocean. It includes 5200 ft Mt Lukins in the Angeles National Forest, threatened species habitats protected by the Federal Register and a Coastal Zone protected through the California Coastal Commission.

Birds and insects fly into these area through the open air and for thousands of years wildlife have been traveling in regular migratory patterns and ranges to hunt and breed between the Santa Monica, Verdugo and San Gabriel Mountains, but ever increasing population and building density in the hillsides are changing entire species and endangered their viability.

River restoration and habitat islands will never be the answer to our earth bound wildlife. No regard is currently considered when those animals' terrestrial migrations are blocked. Entire food chains including top predators such as our Griffith Park mountain lion P22, are being forced down into the urban zones to find food and are increasingly encountering humans. The timing for this motion for a wildlife habitat linkage ordinance is critical.

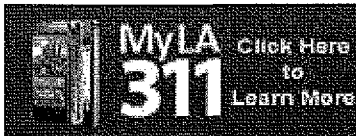
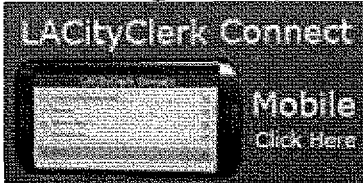

Dear Chairman Huizar and Honorable Members of the PLUM Committee,

I am a Citizen for Los Angeles Wildlife and I support a Wildlife Habitat Linkage Zone ordinance.

Los Angeles is a unique city in that it has a wilderness mountain range running through its center stretching from East LA to Griffith Park to the Pacific Ocean. For thousands of years wildlife have been traveling in regular migratory patterns and ranges to hunt and breed within those Santa Monica Mountains but ever increasing population and building density in the hillsides are changing entire species and endangered their viability.

As wildlife habitats are blocked those animals that survive (such as our Griffith Park mountain lion P22) are being forced down into the urban zones to find food and are increasingly encountering humans. The timing for this motion for a wildlife habitat linkage ordinance is critical.

Such an action will prevent further injuries and deaths to wildlife, and protect the remaining open spaces, ecosystems and wildlife linkages that exist. Incursions into the habitat of wildlife in the city is counter to the intent and protections offered under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA).

It needs to be passed now.
