To: sharon.gin@lacity.org At the public hearing held on June 3, 2014 (continued from previous meetings), the Planning and Land Use Management (PLUM) Committee considered an appeal for property located at 10101 West Wilshire Boulevard. Staff from the Department of City Planning gave the Committee background information on the matter. The appellant's and applicant's representatives also spoke as well as the staff from the Council Office. After an opportunity for public comment, the Committee recommended that Council deny the appeal, sustain the determination of the Zoning Administrator, and approve a variance for property located at 10101 West Wilshire Boulevard. This matter is now forwarded to the Council for its consideration.

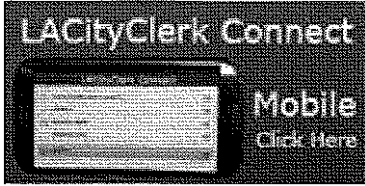

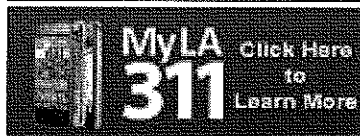

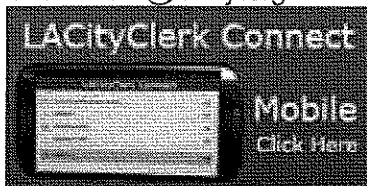
