Again, this is a significant wildlife habitat and should remain thus. Any construction would also interfere with the well-being of the wildlife.

Currently, this area is used for concerts and its participants do not seem to be inconvenienced by using an unimproved location. So why need a permanent stage? Also, this location is used by picnickers and small groups. A permanent stage would interfere with this use by the community.

Please approve the appeal and stop this unnecessary and inappropriate project.
