Leonora Gershman Pitts was born and raised in Grand Forks, ND. A dancer, singer, and actress for nearly her entire life, she spent most of her childhood treading the boards of her local community theater. She left Grand Forks at age eighteen to attend New York University's Tisch School of the Arts, where received her BFA in Drama. At NYU, she studied with the Atlantic Theater Company Acting School, founded by William H. Macy and David Mamet. Upon her graduation, she received the Outstanding Achievement Award from the Atlantic and NYU, and a year later, Atlantic hired Leonora onto their faculty, where she taught for the following three years.

Leonora appeared in numerous stage productions off and off-off Broadway in New York and in regional productions in New Jersey. In 2003, she made the move to Los Angeles where she has continued her stage, film, and television career, appearing in the international hit Inside Private Lives (Fremont Center Theater, Edinburgh Fringe Festival, East to Edinburgh Festival), as well as the television series "I Hate My 30's," "Rita Rocks," "It's Always Sunny in Philadelphia," and the upcoming HBO series, "Togetherness," and the films Life of Lemon, and Manson Family Vacation. She has also continued her teaching and coaching career in Los Angeles.

Leonora recently completed her first short film, "God I Hope I Get It," which she co-wrote, directed, and stars in, and which is now making the festival rounds.

In addition to her acting, directing, and teaching career, Leonora is a committed community activist. Having served for five years on the Atwater Village Neighborhood Council, four as co-chair, she worked diligently on such events as the annual Tree Lighting ceremony, the Summer Nights on the Boulevard, the Fall Festival: Trick or Treat on the BOOlevard, and the Movie Nights Under the Stars. She is proud to have secured funding for our local elementary schools, the farmers' market, the Director of Animal Welfare Services, and the Independent Shakespeare Company, among many others, and is the first recipient of the Villager of the Year Award from the Atwater Village Chamber of Commerce.

Leonora's community activism has given her the opportunity to work alongside many of Los Angeles's great leaders, most notably Mayor Eric Garcetti and Council Members Mitch O'Farrell and Tom Labonge. Her working relationship with Council Member Labonge led to her nomination as a Local Volunteer Neighborhood Advisory Committee (LVNOC) for the permanent stage in Griffith Park. Her friendships with Mayor Garcetti and Council Member O'Farrell remain strong, and she was glad to have worked hard on both of their recent campaigns.

Leonora was recently elected onto the Board of Directors of the Independent Shakespeare Company, which brings free Shakespeare in Griffith Park to over 43,000 people annually.

Leonora, her husband Scott, and their two young children live in Eagle Rock with their Scottish Terrier, Molly Malone.
