Dear Hon. Mayor and Members of the City Council,

The Alliance of River Communities, comprised of 14 Neighborhood Councils along the LA River and Arroyo Seco, reviewed and discussed the merits of Council File #14-0907 at its regularly scheduled September meeting.

In a unanimous decision in adamant support of the measure, the ARC joins with other fellow neighborhood councils in urging the City's commitment to reducing green house gasses and emissions to 80% below 1990 levels by the year 2050 and that the DWP meet the same goal by 2030.

We commend Councilmember Koretz for calling for bold action from city departments, and Councilmembers Bonin, O'Farrell and Blumenfield for supporting the initiation of these steps towards a cleaner and healthier environment for all Angelenos.
