TRADE, COMMERCE AND TECHNOLOGY COMMITTEE REPORT relative to actions to reduce the City's carbon dioxide and other greenhouse gas emissions to at least 80 percent below 1990 levels by 2050.

Recommendations for Council action, as initiated by Motion (Koretz - Bonin - Blumenfield - O'Farrell):

- NOTE and FILE reports from City Administrative Officer (CAO), Los Angeles World Airports (LAWA), Los Angeles Harbor Department (LAHD), Sister Cities of Los Angeles, Los Angeles Department of Transportation (LADOT), General Services Department (GSD), Bureau of Street Services (BSS) and Department of Neighborhood Empowerment (DONE) relative to actions to reduce the City's carbon dioxide and other greenhouse gas emissions to at least 80 percent below 1990 levels by 2050.
- 2. INSTRUCT all City departments, including proprietaries, to develop plans to meet the targets in Governor Brown's Executive Order B-30-15 and Executive Order S-3-05. The analysis should include: short, medium and long term solutions, the cost of implementation and reductions in all three classifications of emission sources.

SUMMARY

At the meeting held on December 1, 2015, your Trade, Commerce and Technology Committee considered reports from LAWA, LAHD, Sister Cities of Los Angeles, LADOT, GSD, BSS and DONE relative to actions to reduce the City's carbon dioxide and other greenhouse gas emissions to at least 80 percent below 1990 levels by 2050. During the discussion of the item, the Chair requested to add the recommendation that all City departments, including proprietaries, be instructed to develop plans to meet the targets in Governor Brown's Executive Order B-30-15 and Executive Order S-3-05. The Chair asked that the analysis include short, medium and long term solutions, the cost of implementation, and reductions in all three classifications of emission sources. An opportunity for public comment was held. After a brief discussion, the Committee moved to note and file the reports listed above and to approve the Chair's recommendation, as detailed above.
