RECOMMENDED ACTIONS

- 1. That the Board of Police Commissioners (Board) REVIEW and APPROVE this report.
- That the Board TRANSMIT the attached grant modification for the Fiscal Year (FY) 2014-2015 Selective Traffic Enforcement Program (STEP) from the California Office of Traffic Safety (OTS), pursuant to Administrative Code Section 14.6(a), to the Mayor, Office of the City Administrative Officer (CAO), Chief Legislative Analyst and to the City Clerk for committee and City Council consideration.
- 3. That the Board REQUEST the Mayor and City Council to:
 - A. AUTHORIZE the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) to reprogram funds totaling \$20,000 within the FY 2014-2015 STEP Grant as follows:

(FNS), during the period of October 1, 2014 through September 30, 2015, for a sum not to exceed \$20,000, for the provision of phlebotomist services; The Honorable Board of Police Commissioners Page 2 1.17

C. AUTHORIZE the Controller to increase appropriations as needed from the FY 2014-2015 STEP, account number to be determined, Fund No. 339, Department No. 70, to Fund No. 100, Department No. 70, account number and amount as follows:

> Account No. 001092, Overtime Sworn, \$3,521,640 Account No. 001090, Overtime Civilian, \$160,000; and

D. AUTHORIZE the LAPD to prepare the Controller's instructions for any technical adjustments, subject to the approval of the CAO, and AUTHORIZE and INSTRUCT the Controller to implement the instructions.

DISCUSSION

The LAPD requests approval to reprogram funds totaling \$20,000. The funds would be transferred from the Personnel Costs category to the Contractual Services category. The reprogramming of funds will allow the Department to utilize City Attorney Contract No. C-121496 to pay for the provision of phlebotomist services at the DUI checkpoints. In order to accomplish this, the Department requests approval to reduce the Personnel Costs, DUI/DL Checkpoints line item by \$20,000, and increase the Contractual Services category by the same amount. All other budget and program aspects of the 2014-15 STEP Grant remain unchanged.

PERSONNEL COSTS

Overtime

Overtime for grant funded law enforcement operations may be conducted by personnel such as a Lieutenant, Sergeant, Corporal, Deputy, Officer, Community Services Officer, Dispatcher, etc., depending on the titles used by the agency and the grantees overtime policy. Personnel will be deployed as needed to accomplish the grant goals and objectives.

Costs are estimated based on an overtime hourly rate range of \$35.00/hour to \$110.00/hour.

No benefits will be paid in this grant.

TRAVEL EXPENSE

In State

Costs are included for appropriate staff to attend conferences and training events supporting the grant goals and objectives and/or traffic safety. Local mileage for grant activities and meetings is included. Anticipated travel may include the DUID Seminar. All conferences, seminars or training not specifically identified in the Schedule B-1 (Budget Narrative) must be approved by OTS. All travel claimed must be at the agency approved rate. Per Diem may not be claimed for meals provided at conferences when registration fees are paid with OTS grant funds.


