PUBLIC WORKS & GANG REDUCTIO

Last year the Los Angeles Times published findings in an article titled "Many poorer areas of L.A. get less trash services," stating "more than one-third of pleas to remove refuse from dozens of neighborhoods in Central, Northeast and South L.A. were ignored even as sanitation workers responded to 99% of requests in other parts of the city."

Clean Streets LA, led by Mayor Eric Garcetti and consisting of various City departments, has launched a cooperative effort to address these inequities by meeting the extraordinary need for services required to maintain clean and safe streets. This necessitates that City departments ensure they can work in an efficient and timely manner. It is equally important that this process be shared in a transparent and accessible manner.

To support these efforts, Council District 8 has launched several initiatives to address these concerns at the neighborhood level mobilizing our residents to help identify the areas in most need of cleaning and additional services. These efforts include the "Clean and Safe Streets Campaign" and 311 training with local community organizations, schools, neighborhood councils and block clubs.


I THEREFORE MOVE that the Bureau of Sanitation, in conjunction with the Bureau of Street Services and related departments, be instructed to provide quarterly reports to the City Council on the status of the Clean Streets LA program and efforts to provide adequate services to areas of need; including average response times on bulky item pick-ups, graffiti removal, pothole filling, statistical comparisons across service areas, and the identification of resources to ensure neighborhoods obtain adequate services along with any pertinent relevant information.
