





#1. PROACTIVE SCOUTS:


Develop a Street Conditions
Observation Unit program,
instructing the Board of
Public Works to expand the
scope of the Office of
Community Beautification's

proactively identify and

conditions to the City's 311system.





#2. CLEANLINESS RATING INDEX:

Develop the City's cleanliness rating index. Instruct the Board of Public Works and OCB to regularly measure the cleanliness of the City's streets, neighborhoods, and districts.





#2. CLEANLINESS RATING INDEX:


SUMMARY OF STANDARDS

Feature	Standard
	Streets shall be free of litter and will be rated on a scale of 1 to 3.
	 1 = Very dean, less than 5 pieces of litter per 100 curb feet examined.
1.0 Street	<2 = Acceptably clean (passing), 5-15 pieces of litter per 100 curb feet examined.
Cleanliness	 3 = Very Dirty, over 15 pieces of litter per 100 curb feet examined.
	A final average rating of less than 2 must be attained to meet the standard for the route.
	Sidewalk shall be free of litter and will be rated on a scale of 1 to 3, as above. A final average rating of less than 2 must be attained to meet the standard for the route. Additionally:
2.0 Sidewalk	 90% of sidewalk shall be free of grime, leaks and spills.
Cleanliness	Sidewalk shall be entirely free of illegal dumping.
	 Sidewalk shall be entirely free of feces, needles, broken glass and condoms.
	 Sidewalk shall be entirely free of offensive odors from SF Public Works and non-SF Public Works sources.
3.0 Graffiti	100% of the street surface, public and private structures, buildings and sidewalks must be free of graffiti. The following categories are evaluated:
	 SF Public Works public property (street surfaces, city trash receptacles).
	 Non-SF Public Works public property (street signs, meters, mailboxes, etc).
	Private property
	Sidewalk surfaces
	Trash receptacle is dean and not overflowing.
	 No more than 5 pieces of litter in the area around the receptacle.
4.0 Trash	Structure must have a uniform coat of paint.
Receptacles	 Structure must be free of large cracks or damage that affects use.
	The door must be closed.
	90% of trees, tree wells and planters shall be free of litter.
5.0 Trees and	 90% of trees are free of damage or hanging limbs; no tree is dead.
Landscaping	 90% of tree wells and planters are free of weeds and vines.



#3. TRASH RECEPTACLE PROGRAM:

Instruct the Bureau of Sanitation to develop an enhanced trash receptacle program and work with CAO to identify funding.

#4: FUNDING CLEAN-UPS:

Develop improvements in bulky item pick-up and illegal dumping clean-ups, instructing the Bureau of Sanitation and City Administrative Office to conduct needs assessment and propose financing options.





#5. SUPPORTING BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT DEVELOPMENT:

Develop formal city services agreement with existing BIDs—clarifying City-provided services alongside BID value-added services.

Develop an administrative cost sharing program that optimizes essential BID services for smaller-BIDs

Develop and market the program's value-added benefits to City's commercial corridors.

#6. PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT:

Develop and launch a comprehensive clean and pride pilot campaign that targets the end-users of the City's services and programs.








#7. ENFORCEMENT & COMPLIANCE:

Instruct the Board of Public Works and Bureau of Street Services, in coordination with impacted agencies, to develop and implement an effective system of coordinated enforcement for the City's quality of life laws.



Study best practices adopted across the country to successfully manage supply of vacant and underdeveloped land parcels




A NEW PROCESS FOR PROPERTY DISPOSITION EXISTING CYCLE






#9. UPDATE STREET SWEEPING:

Modernize the City's street sweeping program. Instruct the Board of Public Works, Bureau of Street Services, and Bureau of Sanitation to hire a consultant to assist in developing a new program that executes the City's *Water Quality Compliance Master Plan* urban runoff and trash control goals.
