## **MOTION**

A new housing project at 11815 Burbank Boulevard (between Colfax Avenue and Laurel Canyon Boulevard) is in need of a new water meter system that requires—construction in the roadway. The Los Angeles Fire Department requires the installation of sprinklers in each of the housing units, which will be supported by the new water meter system. In March 2014, the Bureau of Street Services resurfaced Burbank Boulevard adjacent to the new housing units.

An exemption to the City's one-year street cut moratorium is needed by the Department of Water and Power to proceed with the installation of a new water meter system. Exemptions may be made when it can be demonstrated that the City's 30 day notice of the scheduled street resurfacing project was not mailed to the property owner. The property owner claims to not have received such notice.

I THEREFORE MOVE that the Council approve an exception/waiver to the City's one-year street cut moratorium to permit the installation of a water meter system in conjunction with the housing development project located at 11815 Burbank Boulevard, in North Hollywood.

I FURTHER MOVE that the permittee be required to properly repair and resurface the cut area, in accordance with the Bureau of Engineering requirements and standards, and upon completion of the work, be inspected by the Bureau of Contract Administration, to maximize the longevity of the street.

I FURTHER MOVE that the property owner be required to pay the street damage restoration fee at the one-year and one-day fee schedule.
