## PUBLIC WORKS & GANG REDUCTION

This year is the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Watts Riots/Rebellion, which lasted from August 11 to 17 in 1965. During those 6 days, over 30,000 adults participated in the riot in the greater Watts neighborhood. The Watts Riots/Rebellion was the City's most severe riot until 1992 in terms of deaths, injuries, arrests and property damage. The property damage on 103<sup>rd</sup> St earned it the nickname "Charcoal Alley" for the multitude of neighborhood-serving commercial buildings that burned down. The Watts Riots/Rebellion illuminated inequities in Los Angeles, but spoke nationally to the systemic discrimination in American cities.

I THEREFORE MOVE that the Council DIRECT the Department of Cultural Affairs, the Human Relations Commission, and Department of Public Works to report back within 30 days, with a plan of events and activities, a financial plan for covering costs, and additional recommendations for appropriately marking and commemorating the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Watts Riots/Rebellion.
