I own the home where I raised my children and have paid Los Angeles Property tax for almost 28 years. I cannot afford to stay in my home without the income I make from the two rooms in my home I have listed on Airbnb. Because I have diligently paid my mortgage to decrease my loan amount, my monthly mortgage payments are manageable on a very tight budget. BUT, I am unable to afford to stay in the city I have call home for almost 40 years, and where my industry is, if I do not have the Airbnb income. I do not approve of landlords evicting tenants to turn around and rent on the short term rental platforms.
