- -- A 90 day cap is overly restrictive and arbitrary. If the City is trying to limit impacts on housing then the cap should be based on actual data. For example, a recent study found that a full unit would need to be rented on a short-term basis over 177 days in order to financially break even with its use as a long term rental.
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- -- Any registration or permitting process needs to be simple, online, and efficient.

Dear Etta Armstrong, LA City Clerk Office,

I sincerely ask you to consider my wife and I's situation. We live in a one-bedroom apartment in Los Feliz. In 2010 we decided to list our Friday to Sundays on Airbnb.

Here are some facts:

- 1. It is our primary (only) residence.
- 2. We typically rent out one weekend a month, or about 25-30 nights/year.
- 3. All of our neighbors and aware and supportive.
- 4. We have a cat, so the guests watch him while we're away.
- 5. We pay taxes.
- 6. We make on average \$5,000/year, which is over 7% of my income.
- 7. We save part of the money for travel and some for a down payment on a house.
- 8. Our Airbnb has never taken a rental unit off the market.
- 9. With 50+ rent outs, we have never had a complaint from the community.
- Our quad-plex is rent controlled.

If the new ordnance is so sweeping as to limit rent controlled units, that will cut thousands of dollars of my yearly income and will effect the restaurants and shops my guests visit during their stays. I am very active in the Airbnb community and support fair legislation. I do support a mandatory Transient Occupancy Tax collected by Airbnb so I do not have to tack it onto my guest's cost manually. I do support renting only from a primary property.

My friends use Airbnb in a variety of ways. I have a friend in Los Feliz who rents their spare bedrooms in their house. I have a friend in Eagle Rock who rents her vintage airstream in her backyard.

You can see why this issue is so important to me and the thousands of hosts and small buisness in Los Angeles. I ask you to re-consider the rent-controlled limitation since its purpose seems to be redundant to the 90 day/year limitation.
