A friend of mine suggested home sharing on Airbnb, she said that it would help with my medical finances and it would give me an opportunity to meet new people. Since I began hosting, it changed my life both financially and for my heath and wellness. I am able to pay my medical bills and people from all the over the world visit me in the comfort of my own home. I would never have been able to do this or meet these great people if it was not for Airbnb.

I enjoy not only meeting all of my guests but I treat all of my guests like they are family. I am from a family of 11 children so I enjoy and love being around company. To this day, several of my guests check in with me because they are aware of my health conditions.
