I strongly support Carole Nakano's petition to recognize the community of "Sawtelle Japantown" in West Los Angeles. The name, which pays homage to the historic roots of the community, would honor the contributions of Japanese-Americans to this westside neighborhood.

Japanese-Americans began arriving in Los Angeles in the 1890s, with many fleeing anti-Asian persecution in San Francisco. Sawtelle became an ideal home for working Japanese-Americans who were unable to live in nearby restricted communities like Bel-Air, Brentwood and Westwood. In the 1920s, cultural, community and religious organizations like the Japanese Institute of Sawtelle, West Los Angeles Buddhist Temple and United Methodist Church formed to support this vital community. Sawtelle existed as a separate city until 1922, when it was annexed to the City of Los Angeles.

Last year, local community members recognized the need to preserve this important cultural heritage and formed the Sawtelle Japantown Association to begin the process of renaming the neighborhood. This grassroots effort to recognize "Sawtelle Japantown" in West Los Angeles, with boundaries of Santa Monica Blvd. to the north, Pico Blvd. to the south, Centinela Ave. to the west and the I-405 to the east, has collected over 500 signatures in eight months. The designation will serve as an important reminder of the history of our great City and the neighborhoods and people that make it what it is today.

I am honored to recognize the achievements of Japanese-Americans in this vital West L.A. community, and I support the "Sawtelle Japantown" designation and placement of signs on Sawtelle Blvd. at both Olympic and Santa Monica Blvds.

I have reviewed the indexes to the City Council records and the City Archives records inventory database for references to Sawtelle Japantown. The designation "Sawtelle Japantown" appears to be a newly proposed designation and does not appear in the historical record as such. The area proposed to be named was consolidated into the City of Los Angeles as part of the Sawtelle Consolidation in 1922, per ordinance 43,863. The area was part of the formerly independent town of Sawtelle.
