RECOMMENDED ACTIONS

1. That the Board of Police Commissioners (Board) REVIEW and APPROVE this report.
2. That the Board TRANSMIT the attached grant application and award, pursuant to Administrative Code Section 14.6(a), to the Mayor, Office of the City Administrative Officer (CAO), Office of the Chief Legislative Analyst and to the City Clerk for Committee and City Council consideration.
3. That the Board REQUEST the Mayor and City Council to:
 - A. AUTHORIZE the Chief of Police to retroactively apply for and ACCEPT the grant award for the 2015/2016 Internet Crimes Against Children Program in the amount of \$200,000 for the period of July 1, 2015, through June 30, 2016, from the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services;
 - B. AUTHORIZE the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) to spend up to \$200,000 in accordance with the grant award agreement;
 - C. AUTHORIZE the Chief of Police or his designee to negotiate and execute the grant award agreement, subject to City Attorney approval as to form and legality;
 - D. AUTHORIZE the LAPD to submit grant reimbursement requests to the grantor and deposit grant receipts in Fund No. 339, Department No. 70;
 - E. AUTHORIZE the Controller to set up a grant receivable and appropriate \$200,000 to appropriation account, account number to be determined, within Fund No. 339, Department No. 70, for the receipt and disbursement of the 2015/2016 Internet Crimes Against Children Program grant funds;

DISCUSSION

Funds provided under this program are intended to:

- Ensure that local law enforcement agencies are better equipped to investigate computer crimes against children by offenders using the Internet, on-line communication systems, and other technologies;
- Provide educational programs for law enforcement officers, teachers, parents, and children;
- Serve as a forensic resource to law enforcement agencies within the service area;
- Prosecute cases at the local, state and federal level; and,
- Participate in nationally-coordinated investigations.

The LAPD will allocate \$56,940 for salaries, \$38,927 for overtime, \$2,160 for parking, \$1,973 for office supplies, \$61,000 for Cargo Van and \$39,000 for emergency equipment.





Attached for your approval and signature is an Intradepartmental Correspondence to the Board of Police Commissioners requesting approval to transmit the attached grant application and award for the 2015/2016 Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force Program from the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services, pursuant to Administrative Code Section 14.6(a), to the Mayor, Office of the City Administrative Officer, Office of the Chief Legislative Analyst and to the City Clerk for Committee and City Council consideration. The Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) is requesting authorization to accept the \$200,000 grant award for the grant period of July 1, 2015, through June 30, 2016.

The \$200,000 award will provide funding to the Los Angeles Regional Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force (Task Force). This Task Force, directed by the LAPD, is comprised of law enforcement agencies throughout a five county area. The mission of the task force is to prevent, interdict, investigate and prosecute Internet crimes against children and technology-facilitated child exploitation.
