RULES, ELECTIONS, INTERGOVERNMENTAL RELATIONS, AND NEIGHBORHOODS COMMITTEE REPORT and RESOLUTION relative to establishing the City's position regarding H.R. 1076 (King) and S. 551 (Feinstein), which would prohibit known or suspected terrorists from legally purchasing firearms and explosives.

Recommendation for Council Action, pursuant to Resolution (Koretz - Krekorian), SUBJECT TO THE CONCURRENCE OF THE MAYOR:

ADOPT the accompanying RESOLUTION to include in the City's 2015-16 Federal Legislative Program SUPPORT for H.R. 1076 (King) and S. 551 (Feinstein), which would prohibit known or suspected terrorists from legally purchasing firearms and explosives.

<u>Fiscal Impact Statement</u>: None submitted by the Chief Legislative Analyst (CLA). The City Administrative Officer has not completed a financial analysis of this report.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

## <u>SUMMARY</u>

At a special meeting held on January 13, 2016, the Rules, Elections, Intergovernmental Relations, and Neighborhoods Committee considered Resolution (Koretz - Krekorian) and a report from the CLA dated January 11, 2016 relative to establishing the City's position regarding H.R. 1076 (King) and S. 551 (Feinstein), which would prohibit known or suspected terrorists from legally purchasing firearms and explosives. The CLA report, attached to Council file No. 15-0002-S114, provides additional background information and a summary of the Resolution.

After consideration and after providing an opportunity for public comment, the Rules, Elections, Intergovernmental Relations, and Neighborhoods Committee recommended that Council adopt the Resolution. This matter is now forwarded to the Council for its consideration.
