Recommendation for Council action, pursuant to Resolution (Buscaino - Martinez), SUBJECT TO THE CONCURRENCE OF THE MAYOR:

ADOPT the accompanying RESOLUTION to include in the City's State 2015-16 Legislative Program SUPPORT and/or SPONSORSHIP of legislation that would amend the Penal Code to enhance arrest authority for Street Services Investigators, and to add vehicles used by these investigators for the enforcement of overload vehicle permits to the list of authorized emergency vehicles as defined in the Vehicle Code.

<u>Fiscal Impact Statement</u>: None submitted by the Chief Legislative Analyst. The City Administrative Officer has not completed a financial analysis of this report.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

SUMMARY

At its regular meeting held on March 18, 2016, the Rules, Elections, Intergovernmental Relations, and Neighborhoods Committee considered Resolution (Buscaino - Martinez) and a report from the CLA relative to the City's position on legislation that would amend the California Penal Code Section 830.7 to enhance arrest authority for Street Services Investigators and add vehicles used by these investigators to the list of authorized emergency vehicles as defined in California Vehicle Code Section 2416. The CLA report, attached to the Council file, provides additional background information and a summary of the Resolution.

After providing an opportunity for public comment, the Committee recommended Council adopt the accompanying Resolution. This matter is now forwarded to the Council for its consideration.
