

NOTICE TO PROPERTY OWNERS/OCCUPANTS WITHIN A 500-FOOT RADIUS

You are hereby notified that the Planning and Land Use Management (PLUM) Committee of the Los Angeles City Council will hold a public hearing on <u>Tuesday, February 24, 2015</u>, at approximately <u>2:30 p.m.</u>, or soon thereafter, in the Board of Public Works Edward R. Roybal Hearing Room 350, City Hall, 200 North Spring Street, Los Angeles, CA 90012, to consider a Mitigated Negative Declaration and related California Environmental Quality Act findings, a report from the Los Angeles City Planning Commission (LACPC), and appeals filed by Jay Handal and Al Casas, from the entire determination of the LACPC in taking the actions below for the New West Charter School, a Statelicensed charter middle and high school, located at 1905, 1911 and 1915 Armacost Avenue.

- 1. Approved a Plan Approval for Condition Compliance in accordance with Condition 11 of CPC-2011-1923-CU-SPR, and found that New West Charter School has fully complied with the use and operating requirements of the Conditional Use Permit.
- 2. Approved an increase in enrollment from 750 to 875 students for the 2015-2016 school year.
- 3. Approved parking requirements to be met on- or off-site.
- 4. Approved extended school hours to 10:00 p.m. for teacher preparations, school maintenance, parent/teacher conferences, school board meetings and similar school activities.
- 5. Approved a reduction in the number of required traffic studies to one per semester.
- 6. Adopted modified Conditions of Approval and Findings.
- Adopted Mitigated Negative Declaration, ENV-2011-1924-MND, adequately serves as environmental clearance for the project pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act and Section 21082.19(c)(3) of the California Public Resources Code.

The time in which you may seek judicial review of any final action by the City Council is limited by California Code of Civil Procedure Section 1094.6 which provides that an action pursuant to Code of Civil Procedure Section 1094.5 challenging the Council's action must be filed no later than the 90th day following the date on which the Council action becomes final.
