#### 10. Grant Award Summary

The City Attorney's Office requests authority to accept grant funding in the amount of \$125,000 for the Victim Assistance Program. The grant funds are from the Verizon Wireless Foundation and pass through the non-profit organization Peace Over Violence. The grant funds will cover the costs of the design, development, maintenance and support of a Web Interface Case Management System, a mobile application, and a video conferencing component for the Victim Assistance Program. The Web Interface Case Management System and mobile application will provide users program information and services, including information on the California State Victim Compensation Program process and eligibility criteria, answers to frequently asked questions, and links to commonly used resources.

The City Attorney's Office will disburse the grant funding as follows: \$110,000 for a personal services contract to develop the Web Interface Case Management System and mobile application, \$6,000 for the purchase of video conferencing equipment and monthly services fees, and \$9,000 for first year maintenance.

The City Attorney's Office estimates that the annual on-going costs of maintaining and supporting the case management system and mobile application will be \$20,000 per year. The City Attorney's Office will monitor the efficiencies achieved in implementing this technology and will determine if the benefits of the project justify the ongoing costs. According to the City Attorney's Office, this project's ongoing costs may be eligible for additional grant funds accessible through a competitive grant process. At this time, no funding is set aside for the costs of ongoing maintenance and support.

Dear Mayor Garcetti and Honorable Members of City Council:

The Office of the City Attorney is transmitting for your approval its request to accept grant funds from the Verizon Wireless Foundation in the amount of \$125,000 for the period January 15, 2015 through January 14, 2016 to enhance the Victim Assistance Program. These grant funds will increase how services are delivered to violent crime victims through the development of a Smart Phone Application and Web Interface Case Management System. The Verizon Wireless Grant funds will be provided to the City by the non-profit organization Peace Over Violence.

The proposed Mobile App and Web Interface Case Management System Design (for Android and IOS users) will allow victims to more efficiently receive information and services from the City Attorney Victim Assistance Program. The use of this innovative technology will assist victims to access program information and obtain needed services, while creating efficiencies for program staff, our partnering agencies, law enforcement, and prosecutors.

Users of the Mobile App will have immediate access to: Program Information and Services; California State Victim Compensation Program (VCP) process and eligibility criteria; list of answers to frequently asked questions; and direct links to commonly used resources.

There are 10 advocates assigned to the Victim Assistance Program who provide 15 state mandated services pursuant to Penal Code Section 13835.5(a) to victims of crime. The Web Interface component will include a sophisticated Case Management System to seamlessly record relevant case information, collect statistical data and centralize case information from all 10 program offices, eight of which are

placed directly in Los Angeles Police Department Stations within each of the four LAPD Bureaus (LAPD Hollenbeck, Newton, Northeast, 77<sup>th</sup>, Harbor, North Hollywood, Olympic and Wilshire). The Central and Van Nuys offices are located in city municipal offices.

Last fiscal year, the program assisted 7,429 new victims of crime. With more than 7,000 new victims being assisted annually, a great deal of time is spent by the advocates on case file documentation, data collection and statistical reporting. The addition of a Web Interface Case Management System will maximize program efficiency while implementing the state mandated services by reducing duplication, improving statistical accuracy and providing victims with up-to-date case information. The Web Interface and Video Conferencing component will also allow for better use of staff time to ultimately assist more victims of crime. It will be used for staff to virtually attend training/meetings and web seminars which eliminates the need for the advocates to leave their offices, thereby increasing their accessibility to victims. It will also serve as a valuable option for crime victims with mobility challenges or work restrictions by allowing them to contact the Victim Assistance Program staff utilizing their mobile device or computer.

The grant award will not have an impact on the general fund for the first year of the project. All costs to develop, manage, and maintain this project will be included within the \$125,000 grant award during this period. Additional funds will be required to host the mobile application and support the Web Interface Case Management System for subsequent years. The estimated annual costs beyond the first year are \$20,000 per year. The Office of the City Attorney will monitor use of the technology and efficiencies in order to determine whether the benefits of the project justify the ongoing expenditure and expect that additional grant funds will be accessible through a competitive grant process. Efficacy of the project will be measured by the reduction of advocate time dedicated to case file documentation, data collection and statistical reporting as well as their accessibility generated by the video conferencing ability. Also, we will monitor the usage by victims of both the Mobile App and the Web Interface Case Management System to determine its benefit to the victims.

We, therefore, request that the City Council, subject to the approval of the Mayor:

- 1. **APPROVE** the Verizon Wireless Foundation's Technology Grant Award and authorize the City Attorney or his designee to execute the contract between the City of Los Angeles and Peace Over Violence in the amount of \$125,000.
- 2. **AUTHORIZE** the Controller to establish a new appropriation account within Fund 368, entitled 12L820-Victim Assistance Program Mobile App-City Attorney Grant Fund in the amount of \$125,000.
- 3. **AUTHORIZE** the City Attorney or his designee to prepare Controller instructions for any necessary technical adjustment, subject to the approval of the City Administrative Officer, and instruct the Controller to implement the instructions.

# AGREEMENT NUMBER BETWEEN THE CITY OF LOS ANGELES AND PEACE OVER VIOLENCE

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into this 15<sup>th</sup> day of October, 2014, by and between the City of Los Angeles, a municipal corporation ("CITY"), acting by and through the Office of the Los Angeles City Attorney ("City Attorney"), and Peace Over Violence ("POV" or "CONTRACTOR"), a non-profit 501c3 organization.

WHEREAS, POV is a non-profit 501c3 organization, multicultural community based and volunteer centered organization dedicated to building healthy relationships, families and communities free from sexual, domestic, and interpersonal violence; and

WHEREAS, Verizon Wireless has agreed to provide a one-time donation of \$125,000 from its "Hopeline Grant Funds" ("Verizon Donation") to POV for the purposes of supporting the Los Angeles City Attorney's efforts to develop and implement a Smart Device Application and supporting services to assist the citizens of Los Angeles in combating domestic violence; and

WHEREAS, upon receipt of the Verizon Donation, and approval by Los Angeles City Council to accept the Verizon Donation, POV shall transfer the Verizon Donation to the Office of the City Attorney, for the purposes of developing and implementing the Smart Device Application as specified in this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the services provided by POV will further its organization's mission; and

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the promises, representations, covenants and agreements set forth herein, the parties agree as follows:

#### 1.0 PARTIES TO THE AGREEMENT AND REPRESENTATIVES

#### 1.1 Parties to the Agreement

- 1.1.1 The City of Los Angeles, a municipal corporation, having its principal office at 200 North Spring Street, Los Angeles, California, 90012.
- 1.1.2 Contractor, Peace Over Violence, a 501c3 organization, having its principal address at 1015 Wilshire Blvd., Suite 200, Los Angeles, CA 90017.

#### 1.2 Representatives of the Parties

The representatives of the parties who are authorized to administer this Agreement and to whom formal notices, demands, and communications will be given are as follows:

- 1.3 Formal notices, demands and communications to be given hereunder by either party must be made in writing and may be effected by personal delivery or by registered or certified mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested and will be deemed communicated as of the date of mailing.
- 1.4 If the name of the person designated to receive the notices, demands or communications or the address of such person is changed, written notice must be provided as described in this Agreement, within five (5) business days of such change.

#### SCOPE OF SERVICES:

**POV** shall provide a one-time payment to the CITY, of the Verizon Donation in the amount of \$125,000, subject to the Los Angeles City Council's approval. These funds will be used to:

Develop the Smart Device Application;

- Develop a Web Interface Case Management System;
- Maintain and Update the Smart Device Application;
- Purchase Video Conference Equipment;
- · Pay monthly Video Conference Service fees;
- Pay to Advertise and Promote the Smart Device Application

## 3. PERFORMANCE:

POV shall not transfer the Verizon Donation to the Los Angeles City Controller's Office until POV receives written notice that the Los Angeles City Council has voted and approved that the CiTY is allowed (i) to receive the Verizon Donation; and (ii) the Verizon Donation is to be placed in a "Trust Fund" with the Los Angeles City Controller's Office. Upon receipt of the Verizon Donation, and approval to accept the Verizon Donation by City Council, POV will provide the Verizon Donation to the CITY as specified above. POV's only responsibilities under this Agreement are: (i) to retain the Verizon Donation in its custody and control until it receives the written notice from the CITY as specified above; and (ii) transfer the Verizon Donation to the CITY consistent with the written notice specified above. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to require POV to be responsible for directly or indirectly providing any of the services described in Paragraph 2 above.

## 4. TERM:

The term of this Agreement will begin on January 15th, 2015 and will terminate on January 15, 2016, or upon receipt by the CITY of such funds as specified in Paragraph 1, whichever occurs sooner.

#### 5. COMPENSATION:

POV has agreed not to accept any compensation from the CITY, as the services provided under this contract further POV's mission.

#### 6. ADMINISTRATION OF AGREEMENT:

- A. For purposes of this Agreement, the Los Angeles City Attorney, or his designated representative, shall act as the CITY'S Project Director, who shall have full authority to act for the CITY in the administration of the Agreement consistent with the terms and conditions contained herein.
- B. The CITY will be responsible for providing any required reports to Verizon Wireless as it pertains to use of the Verizon Donation.
- C. POV'S Executive Director or designated representative, shall have full authority to act for POV in the administration of this Agreement consistent with the terms and conditions contained herein.
- D. The CITY and POV will adhere to all provisions of this Agreement. Should either of the PARTIES become aware of issues of mutual concern, the PARTIES agree to meet and confer within five (5) days of identifying said issue, and act in good faith to resolve the issue, prior to taking any legal action against the other PARTY.

## CHOICE OF LAW AND VENUE:

This Agreement shall be deemed to have been executed and delivered within the State of California, and the rights and obligations of the parties hereunder, and any action arising from or relating to this agreement, shall be construed and enforced in accordance with, and governed by, the laws of the State of California or United States law, without giving effect to conflict of laws principles. Any action or proceeding arising out of or relating to this agreement shall be brought in the County of Los Angeles, State of California, and each party hereto irrevocably consents to such jurisdiction and venue, and waives any claim of inconvenient forum.

#### 8. ALTERATION OF TERMS:

This writing fully expresses all understandings between the parties concerning the matters covered herein and shall constitute the total agreement. No addition to, or alteration of, the terms of this agreement, whether by written or verbal understanding of the PARTIES, their officers, employees or agents, shall be valid and effective unless

made in the form of a written amendment to this agreement formerly approved and executed by both parties.

## 9. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Agreement constitutes the complete and entire agreement between CITY and CONTRACTOR and supersedes any prior representations, understandings, communications, commitments, agreements, or proposals, oral or written. No verbal agreement or conversation with any officer or employee of either party will affect or modify any of the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

This Agreement is executed in four (4) duplicate originals, each of which is deemed to be an original.
