I am a Landlord in the Miracle Mile Area and am passionately opposed to the implementation of an HPOZ in our

neighborhood. I also am a member of the MMRA and I am disheartened to learn that an organization that is supposed to promote the well being of a neighborhood is instead using thuggish tactics to get supporters. The MMRA has taken to threatening tenants that they will be evicted if they do not support the HPOZ.

The MMRA initially introduced the HPOZ to stop the development of McMansions in the neighborhood. Since the introduction of the proposed HPOZ for Miracle Mile

regulations have changed immensely. You all have worked tirelessly over the last few years to pass a Baseline Mansionization Ordinance and Baseline Hillside Ordinance.

Less than a week ago all your hard work was fulfilled with the passage of ordinances that will most likely be signed by Mayor Garcetti and thus implemented in our City. As

Councilmen Koretz stated, "I think this will be an end to giant boxy homes that tower over their neighbors."

The amendments that you have passed squarely target the Mansionization fears of some of the Miracle Mile residents. Since the amendments are designed to target

this concern there is no reason to additionally implement an HPOZ. Doing so, basically says the amendments are not

Dear Council Members:

I am a landlord in the (Proposed) Miracle Mile HPOZ ("HPOZ") since 1998. Two nights ago at 10:30pm (Sunday, March 6, 2017) I received a telephone call from a tenant fearing that he will soon be evicted. He called in response to flyers that were affixed to the front door of his apartment (copies attached). The flyers suggest that unless the HPOZ is approved, tenants in the Miracle Mile community may soon be evicted. I reassured the tenant that I have no plans to evict him or any tenant, as well as have no plans to sell the building.

The flyers were distributed by HPOZ proponents, a subgroup of select members within the Miracle Mile Residential Association ("MMRA") who have the support of the MMRA Board. As a member of the MMRA, I am against the HPOZ and furthermore I am appalled by and do not agree with this subgroup's misleading tactics.

This subgroup of HPOZ supporters of the MMRA purpose is clear – to scare tenants into supporting the HPOZ by threatening them with eviction.

The HPOZ subgroup has embarked on a campaign of running loose with the facts, misleading the community and worse; creating unnecessary fear in the community, pitting neighbor against neighbor. Our Miracle Mile community is compromised of proud members and residents who are above this kind of childish behavior. The HPOZ issue has exposed the MMRA as the conniving and ruthless organization it can be.

The MMRA initially introduced the HPOZ as an anti-mansionization tool. The HPOZ is being "rushed through" in efforts by CD4 to not leave the neighborhood "unprotected" from mansionization when the Interim Control Ordinance (ICO) expires around March 25, 2017. The ICO covers single family, R-1 lots. Ironically, the ICO does not cover multifamily housing units. During the last two years there has not been a "rush" of evictions and redevelopment of multi-family properties. The MMRA proponents suggest the "rush" will occur when the ICO expires. This is not true. Multifamily housing parcels in the HPOZ area are already protected from additional regulations put in place by the city. In addition, the costs involved with replacing rent-stabilized units with other projects is economically unfeasible. It is a lengthy and costly process that makes it nearly impossible for any Mom and Pop landlord. It just won't happen.

Once again, Mom and Pop landlords are the target of the City and it's inability to address and solve the problem of housing in the City of Los Angeles.

The Miracle Mile community has existed for nearly 100 years without an HPOZ with very little change to its residential area. It is unreasonable to suggest that it will quickly be demolished and transformed if the HPOZ is not approved.

The City of Los Angeles PLUM Committee and the City Council must be made aware of the shenanigans that are going on in our neighborhood and I strongly urge the PLUM Committee and Council Members to not move forward with approving the Miracle Mile HPOZ.
