The donation is for the benefit of the Los Angeles Police Department (Department), Detective Support and Vice Division, Mental Health Unit (MEU), Crisis Support Section (CRSS). The 36-hour course was first developed by MEU in 2014 and received California Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) certification on December 14, 2014. The MHIT course is designed for first responding officers to develop and enhance the ability to effectively handle persons with mental illness. The MHIT course teaches officers the objective signs and symptoms of mental illnesses, commonly encountered in the field and provides officers with strategies to properly engage and de-escalate situations that involve people who experience mental health crisis. In effect, it is designed to minimize the risk of injury to both the officer and the person in crisis. The donation also includes technology equipment, software and supplies. On March 24, 2015, Nicole Trujillo, Information Technology Bureau, approved the use of the equipment, software and supplies for use by the Department. All items purchased will be covered by manufacturers extended warranty.

The Department has embarked on providing MHIT, a 36-hours course, designed for front line officers to aid in the management and handling of calls for service involving persons suffering from a mental illness. The goal is to provide this California Peace Officer Standards and Training approved course on a monthly basis. In support of this training effort, the MEU Training Detail has identified specific equipment and supply needs in order to ensure this training strategies success.

Due to the timing of the certification of the course from the California Peace Officer Standards and Training, it was mid-budget cycle.

What objectives will be accomplished if the funding is granted?

The funding will provide for the initial purchase of much needed equipment and supplies necessary to properly launch and sustain this training strategy. By engaging in this strategy the Department will ensure that officers receive state of the art training to better serve this extremely vulnerable population.

How many officers will be impacted with this grant?

The training session will consist of 25 officers each month on an ongoing basis.

How will the community be impacted by this grant?

The community will benefit from a better trained police force, ensuring that officers are familiar with the objective signs and symptoms of commonly encountered mental illnesses. It will also provide officers with tools to properly engage and de-escalate calls for service involving persons suffering from a mental health crisis. The MHIT is already supported by several community advocacy groups, such as the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) and the Autism Society of Los Angeles (ASLA).

"Comprehensive Retraining of All Police Officers on Mental Health Issues recognition," was one of the five recommendations made by the Los Angeles Urban Policy Roundtable President Earl Ofari Hutchinson to the Department as a part of the Ezell Ford-Police Conflict Reduction Plan.

Describe the short term outcome and long term impact you anticipate within the Department and in the community it serves as result of this grant.

The anticipated short term outcome will be the immediate implementation of the this training, focusing initially on units within the Department that have a high incidence of contact with persons suffering from a mental illness, such as the officers assigned to the Central Area Safer Cities Initiative. As the number of officers trained increases, the long term goal will be to have a cadre of officers who have received the MHIT, identified by a pin worn on their uniform, available to incident commanders and the public at large to assist in the management of calls for service involving persons suffering from a mental illness, who are in crisis. These officers will be familiar with common mental illnesses and crisis communications skills, which will result in the successful de-escalation and management of these types of calls for service.

How can the Foundation evaluate success if the funding is granted? (# of people served, objectives reached, surveys, etc.)

The Department has a current strategy in place to document, track and assess its overall response to persons suffering from a mental illness, who are in crisis. Additional tracking mechanisms can be put in place to assess the success of the training and the response of those officers who have received the training. Additionally the critiques from the course can be made available, which will gauge the response of those officers who have taken the course and its perceived usefulness.
