

Overview

K2 Solutions, Inc., of Southern Pines, North Carolina, is the nation's premier provider of operationally sound and tactically trained Stand-Off Detection Dogs (SODDs). The SODD is a purpose-driven dog specifically developed by K2's professional canine trainers for off-leash employment by ground combat units and those performing security force missions. SODDs help keep their handlers out of harm's way by searching off-leash for target odor at distances of up to 300 meters away.


