PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE REPORT relative to establishing a Hollywood Entertainment Zone (Zone), defined as encompassing the public sidewalks on both sides of Hollywood Boulevard between Highland Avenue and Orange Drive, incorporating the regulation of first amendment expressive activity in the Zone.

Recommendations for Council action, as initiated by Motion (O'Farrell - LaBonge):

- REQUEST the City Attorney to draft an ordinance establishing a Zone, defined as encompassing the public sidewalks on both sides of Hollywood Boulevard between Highland Avenue and Orange Drive, incorporating the regulation of first amendment expressive activity in the Zone as delineated in the Board of Police Commissioners report dated June 17, 2016, attached to the Council file.
- REQUEST the City Attorney to refer the draft ordinance to the Los Angeles Police
 Department for review and comment to include an implementation plan which will be
 developed in coordination with Council District 13 and other City Departments to identify
 the necessary costs for staffing and administration of the ordinance.

<u>Fiscal Impact Statement</u>: None submitted by the Board of Police Commissioners. Neither the City Administrative Officer nor the Chief Legislative Analyst has completed a financial analysis of this report.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

SUMMARY

At the meeting held on June 21, 2016, your Public Safety Committee considered a Board of Police Commissioners report relative to public safety issues and the tourist experience in Hollywood, in particular in the area of Hollywood Boulevard between Highland Avenue and Orange Drive. The Board of Police Commissioners reports that on April 19, 2016, the Public Safety Committee of the Los Angeles City Council discussed Council File 15-0798, Motion (O'Farrell - LaBonge) relative to public safety challenges on Hollywood Boulevard between Highland Avenue and Orange Drive. As a result of the discussion, the Public Safety Committee instructed the Los Angeles Police Department, with the assistance of the City Attorney's Office, the Bureau of Street Services, and the Tourism and Convention Board, to produce a written report back on policies and procedures that could be adopted to address the public safety challenges on Hollywood Boulevard between Highland Avenue and Orange Drive, An opportunity for public comment was held. After further discussion of the matter, the Committee moved to approve the recommendations of the Board of Police Commissioners contained in the report, as detailed above. This matter is now forwarded to the Council for its consideration.
