DRAFT ORDINANCE CREATING A STREAMLINED PERMITTING PROCESS FOR SMALL RESIDENTIAL ROOFTOP SOLAR ENERGY SYSTEMS

Honorable Members:

Pursuant to City Council action of August 11, 2015, this Office hereby transmits for your consideration, approved as to form and legality, the enclosed draft ordinance adding Section 91.106.5 to the Los Angeles Municipal Code to provide a streamlined permitting process for small residential rooftop solar energy systems. California Assembly Bill 2188 (2014) mandates that every local jurisdiction adopt such an ordinance on or before September 30, 2015.

Summary of Ordinance Provisions

The enclosed draft ordinance creates a streamlined permitting process for solar energy systems that satisfy enumerated size, safety and height requirements. Qualified solar energy systems shall be eligible for online notice of all permitting requirements, online submission of permit applications, electronic signature of all forms, timely notice of any application deficiency, and consolidated and timely inspections.

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CEQA Determination

The adoption of the draft ordinance is exempt from the California Environmental Act (CEQA) under California Public Resources Code Section 21080(b)(1) as a ministerial project. As explained above, California Assembly Bill 2188 (2014) mandates that every local jurisdiction adopt a streamlined permitting process for small residential rooftop solar energy systems in substantial conformance with state law requirements. The ordinance's adoption is also exempt under California Public Resources Code Section 21080.35 as regarding the installation of solar energy systems on the roofs of existing buildings.

Charter Findings Not Required

The draft ordinance is not a land use ordinance and, therefore, not subject to the procedures required before the adoption of a land use ordinance, including referral to the City Planning Commission under Charter Section 558.

Council Rule 38 Referral

A copy of the draft ordinance was sent, pursuant to Council Rule 38, to the Department of Building and Safety, with a request that all comments and recommendations, if any, be presented directly to the City Council when this matter is considered.
