SUBJECT: CORRECTION TO AUGUST 2, 2018 REPORT ON COUNCIL FILE 15-1022-S2 REGARDING NEIGHBORHOOD COUNCIL ELECTIONS TIMING

Honorable Members:

Since the filing of our August 2, 2017 elections report, we've had corrections and updates to the number of Neighborhood Council actions on the timing of the Neighborhood Council elections. Of the 96 Neighborhood Councils that received the form, 27 instead of 25 took action with the following results:

 Conduct 2018 Neighborhood Council elections as scheduled. Board members would have 3 year terms. For boards with staggered terms, this would also require the term extension of board seats ending in 2020 by one year for 2021 elections at which time the entire board would be up and would have to restagger with 2 and 4 year terms per the Neighborhood Council's decision.

Board members elected in 2018 would have 1 year terms and board members with staggered terms could either be extended by 2020 by 1 year for 2021 elections or shortened by 1 year to 2019 per the Neighborhood Council's decision.
