



In response to your request dated December 1, 2014, our office is providing the Financial Impact Statements for the following measures that will appear on the March 3, 2015 ballot.

- New election dates and schedules; one-time adjustment to align terms with new election dates by 2020 (Charter Amendment 1)
- New election dates and schedules for the LAUSD; one-time adjustment to align terms with new election dates by 2020 (Charter Amendment 2)

Voters will have to pass both measures for the Charter Amendments to become effective. The Financial Impact Statements for both measures are attached.
