M O T I O N

I MOVE that the matter of the Communication from Chair and Member, Arts, Parks, and River Committee and Rules, Elections, Intergovernmental Relations, and Neighborhoods Committee Report relative to establishing Indigenous Peoples Day as a legal City holiday, Item 13 on today's Council Agenda (CF 15-1343), **BE AMENDED** to revise the recommendations of the Rules, Elections, Intergovernmental Relations, and Neighborhoods Committee Report, as follows:

1. *Revise Recommendation 2 to read:* APPROVE the creation of an Indigenous People's' Day as an official City holiday, to be observed on August 9th - the United Nations International Day of the World's Indigenous Peoples - and to be recognized no later than the 2019 calendar year.
2. *Revise Recommendation 3 to read:*
 - a. REQUEST the City Attorney to prepare and present an ordinance amending the Los Angeles Administrative Code (LAAC) to remove all references to Columbus Day as an official City holiday, and;
 - b. INSTRUCT the Immigrant Affairs, Civil Rights and Equity Committee to report with recommendations for the name of a replacement holiday on the second Monday of each October which recognizes the contributions of, and celebrates ALL of the diverse cultures in the City of Los Angeles.
3. *Revise Recommendation 5 to read:* INSTRUCT the City Clerk to prepare and send a letter to the Los Angeles Unified School District Board of Education (LAUSD Board), subsequent to official Council action, indicating that the City will now recognize Indigenous People's Day on August 9th.
4. *Revise Recommendation 6 to read:* INSTRUCT the City Administrative Officer to report on the process of implementing an additional City holiday, potential fiscal impacts, and the identification of any issues which may be subject to 'meet and confer' with City unions.



