

Subject: **LOS ANGELES ADMINISTRATIVE CODE AMENDMENT – INDIGENOUS PEOPLES DAY HOLIDAY FOR CITY EMPLOYEES (C.F. 15-1343)**

Recommendations

1. That the City Council, subject to approval by the Mayor, adopt the attached ordinance, approved as to form and legality by the City Attorney, amending Los Angeles Administrative Code Section 4.119 to create an Indigenous Peoples Day as a legal holiday for City employees, and remove the reference to Columbus Day.
2. That the City Council authorize the Controller and City Administrative Officer to correct any clerical errors, or, if approved by the City Attorney, any technical errors in the above ordinance.

Summary

On August 30, 2017, the City Council took action to create an Indigenous Peoples Day as an official holiday for City employees, to be observed on the second Monday of each October (C.F. 15-1343). In the same matter, the City Council also requested that the Los Angeles Administrative Code (LAAC) be amended to remove all references to Columbus Day as an official City holiday. The attached ordinance accomplishes both actions.

Fiscal Impact

There is no fiscal impact associated with the above-described amendment to the LAAC.
