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Ordinance Requests of The City Council if City Council votes in favor

Rate Roll-Back Structure: I/WE request an ordinance with a clear rate roll-back structure, tied to credible and published measurement of the water supply and completion of the infrastructure, as defined by non-biased entities.

Separation of Infrastructure Rate Increases from Drought Rate Increases: I/WE request the rate structure clearly and permanently separate proposed infrastructure rate increases from drought rate increases. This will circumvent rate comingling and facilitate rate reduction when the water supply is adequate to declare the drought over. A commingled structure with commingled rates typically never results in a credible roll-back.

3rd Party Due Diligence Review of Proposed Ordinance and Monitoring if Implemented: I/WE request the City Council hire an independent an unbiased expert(s) and –or- water agency of absolutely no affiliation with LADWP to review and make recommendations regarding the proposed rate restructure and provide on-going monitoring into the future should it pass.

Special Citizen-Customer Oversight Committee: I/WE request the City Council and Mayor's Office appoint a Special Citizen-Customer Oversight Committee to provide a measure of stakeholder empowerment outside of the current power structure.

Vote by Referendum: I/WE request a Vote by Referendum – Or - Other Fair & Reasonable Process in keeping with "written protests" using current social media and communication methods.....to provide for full visibility and accounting of the customer/stakeholders right to vote. The notice of December, City Council hearing February 17, 2016, with only a Mail in Vote may be in accord with law (California Constitution Article XIII D, Section 6), but it does not serve to provide a credible and statistical vote from the customer/stakeholder given the size and breadth of the service area and those served. Use of both Survey Monkey and Snail Mail would be better than only a Mail in Vote and Council Hearing. One might argue that the current process intends to squash a majority protest and Local Leaders should seek a legal opinion regarding the medium which conform to "written protests" if the peoples vote does in fact count.

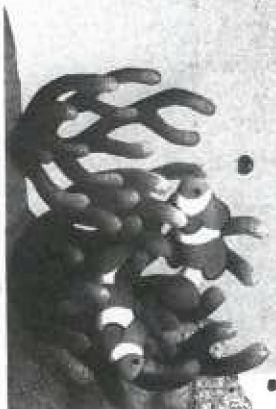

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I protest.

Rather than burdening ratepayers with another rate increase, DWP should instead help finance the project by cutting employee pay.

The inflated pay of DWP employees should be brought into the same universe as comparable private-sector salaries to help pay for new department costs.

As detailed in a recent paper by TransparentCalifornia.com, DWP employee pay is up to three times greater than that of its private-sector counterparts. The average full-time, year-round DWP employee made \$114,941 in 2013. This is despite providing a level of service that in 2011 had it ranked the 13th most hated company in the nation in one survey.

As the Daily News reported then, 13% of the utility's 8,880 employees were paid at least \$100,000. Now, 53% of its 10,299 employees are paid at least that amount.

DWP custodians made an average \$70,893 in total pay in 2013, compared with the Los Angeles market average for janitors and cleaners of \$26,810, as reported by the Bureau of Labor and Statistics. DWP plumbers earned an average of \$121,450, compared with the BLS average wage for Los Angeles plumbers, pipefitters and steamfitters of \$65,350. DWP security officers earned \$87,021 — more than triple the \$26,640 BLS average for Los Angeles security guards.
