We object to the proposed Water Rate Restructure.

1. The proposed rates are punitive and have nothing to do with the actual cost of providing water.

- 2. The water needs of homeowners in the warmer regions in the San Fernando Valley differ from those in the cooler areas. Seasonal adjustments for the warmer areas must be retained.
- 3. The City Council and the DWP have approved many rate increases recently, apparently without demanding any infrastructure maintenance requirements. The city restriction on when to water placed added strain on the aging pipes, resulting in ruptures, damage and waste of water. Customers should not be required to pay the cost of this mismanagement.
- 4. The archaic system of billing every two months should be changed to monthly billing immediately, regardless of the status of the proposed restructure. In the old days, when bills were small, this made sense. Now it poses financial hardships on customers with fixed incomes, including many senior citizens like us. A rate increase would make this even worse. Could the Council members afford to pay a utility bill that approaches ½ of their monthly income during the summer months? The argument that DWP can't afford to read meters every month is not valid. They can keep the same schedule, but allow customers to pay the bill in two segments, one per month. Currently, you have to be delinquent on your bills (ruining your credit rating) to qualify for payment options. This must be changed.

- 5. The City Council should cut through the alphabet soup of this proposal and require the DWP to identify the real costs of:
 - a) Purchasing and purifying 1 HCF of water;
 - b) Paying staff;
 - c) Providing pension benefits;
 - d) Repairing or replacing the aging infrastructure.
- 6. Alternative methods of paying for infrastructure improvements should be reviewed. Bond measures, state water improvement funding, and use of the City Utility Users Tax should be considered.
