The driver described as a 6-foot 2-inch, 280 pound balding, gray-haired man between 50 and 60-year old, got back in the Dodge Caravan and drove away, leaving the dog behind. The person or persons responsible for this crime represent an ongoing threat to the safety of the people of Los Angeles. Unless withdrawn or paid by City Council action, this offer of reward shall terminate on, and have no effect after, DECEMBER 15, 2016. The provisions of payment and all other considerations shall be governed by Chapter 12 of Division 19 of the LAAC Code, as amended by Ordinance Nos. 158157 and 166666.
