DISCUSSION

The donation is for the benefit of the Bomb Detection Canine Section, Emergency Services Division (ESD) and the Los Angeles Police Department (Department). The Bomb Detection Canine Section will soon take possession of five new Ford Sport Utility Vehicles (SUV) that will be placed into operations upon delivery. These SUVs are not equipped with an air conditioning system for the rear canine kennel. A dedicated air conditioning system for the kennel will ensure proper ventilation and temperature control for the canine. The rear air conditioner will work with the existing automated temperature control system already equipped on each SUV. Director of Police Transportation George Yamanaka of Motor Transport Division (MTD) has advised that the equipment meets Department and City standards, and that it would be in the Department's best interest to have the air conditioners installed. Parts and labor come with a two-year warranty from the time of installation, and MTD will take care of maintenance after the warranty period. Emergency Services Division has a restricted fund with the Los Angeles Police Foundation (Foundation). The Foundation will use funds from this account to pay for the cooling systems, installation and labor costs.

No expressed or implied commitments or promises were made to the donor or representatives of the donor. The donor will not receive any preferential treatment, endorsement, or

recommendation; and the donor is not allowed the use of any Los Angeles Police Department (Department) patents.

Administrative Services Bureau has reviewed the donation and determined that it has been submitted in accordance with Section 5.467 et seq. of the Los Angeles Administrative Code, which provides for the receipt and acceptance of donations to the Department.
