DISCUSSION

The donation is for the benefit of Gang and Narcotics Division (GND) and the Los Angeles Police Department (Department). The vehicles shall be marked in the Fleet Management System as Temporary Fleet Increase status and will be considered as part of the Department's vehicle fleet resource. They will be used in a Joint Task Force with the United States Marshals Service (USMS) for surveillance and apprehension of violent fugitives in the City of Los Angeles. Motor Transport Division (MTD) will be responsible for maintenance until the vehicles reach replacement age or become unsafe to operate. The vehicles shall be stripped and salvaged by MTD pursuant to the City's vehicle salvage protocols, and Department budgeted funds shall not be used to replace these vehicles. The emergency equipment will be installed by an outside vendor selected by the USMS. Mr. George Yamanaka, Commanding Officer of MTD, has approved the acceptance of the vehicles into the fleet and has agreed to accept the responsibilities of this donation.

No expressed or implied commitments or promises were made to the donor or representatives of the donor. The donor will not receive any preferential treatment, endorsement, or recommendation; and the donor is not allowed the use of any Department patents.

It is requested that Administrative Services Bureau approve and forward correspondence to the Board of Police Commissioners to accept the unsolicited donation totaling \$100,899, from the United States Marshals Service (USMS) in the form of three vehicles and emergency equipment.

Final Price of Vehicles:	\$ 85,899
Installation of Emergency Equipment, radio and storage lock boxes:	\$ 15,000

The donation is for the benefit of the City of Los Angeles, which plans to use these vehicles in a Los Angeles Police Department, Joint Task Force with the USMS. The task force will use the vehicles in the surveillance and apprehension of violent fugitives having committed crimes in the City of Los Angeles.

The indicated vehicles shall be marked in the Fleet Management System as Temporary Fleet Increase status, and will be considered as part of the Department's vehicle fleet resource. The below listed vehicles, shall be maintained and repaired per law enforcement and the Department's fleet maintenance standards. Motor Transport Division (MTD) will be responsible to manage the vehicle maintenance and operational needs until the affected vehicle reaches replacement age and/or becomes unsafe to operate. Motor Transport Division shall strip and salvage the affected vehicle pursuant to the city's vehicle salvage protocols. The affected vehicle shall be considered as part of the donated group vehicles, and Department's budget funds shall not be used to replace them. Mr. George Yamanaka, Commanding Officer, MTD, was consulted and has agreed to accept the responsibilities of this donation.

Emergency equipment is being installed by West Coast Lights and Sirens, 601 Columbia, Unit B, Riverside, California 92507, telephone number, (951)779-9257 an outside vendor selected by the USMS. Communications Center is the source for all USMS emergency equipment installations, and in compliance with Title 13.




