

PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE REPORT relative to the donation of the Records Management System (RMS) for the benefit of the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD).

Recommendation for Council action:

ACCEPT the donation of the RMS, valued at \$425,000, from the Los Angeles Police Foundation, for the benefit of the LAPD; and, THANK the donor for this generous donation.

Fiscal Impact Statement: None submitted by the Board of Police Commissioners (Board). Neither the City Administrative Officer nor the Chief Legislative Analyst has completed a financial analysis of this report.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

SUMMARY

In a report to the Board dated March 3, 2017, attached to the Council file, the LAPD recommends that the Board approve the donation of the RMS from the Los Angeles Police Foundation for the benefit of the LAPD. The LAPD reports that it is implementing the RMS to modernize aging mainframe systems and applications in support of the Connected Officer Program. This will be the largest and most complex component of the Department's modernization effort, as this system houses all operational data and will affect nearly every aspect of the Department. The donation includes more servers and more storage. Remaining funds will be used for a support upgrade of the existing storage array. The RMS will also allow officers in the field to be connected via mobile field reporting and mobile applications for the collection and delivery of data to support officer safety and situational awareness. The RMS will increase the overall efficiency and speed of the services the Department provides to the community.

At the meeting held on April 4, 2017, your Public Safety Committee considered this matter. An opportunity for public comment was held. After a brief discussion, the Committee recommended that Council approve the donation of the RMS for the benefit of the LAPD, as recommended by the Board, as detailed above. This matter is now forwarded to the Council for its consideration.
