SUMMARY

In a report to the Board of Police Commissioners dated January 12, 2016, attached to the Council file, the LAPD recommends that the Board approve the donation of building materials and labor from the Supporters of Law Enforcement in Devonshire for the benefit of the LAPD, Devonshire Area. The LAPD reports that the donation will be utilized for the remodel and repair of the Watch Commanders Office, Records Unit and the Juvenile Detention Room, and will include materials such as ceiling tiles, paint, desks, bookshelves, and television monitors. Thom Brennan, Commanding Officer, Facilities Management Division, has approved the construction for Devonshire Area. There are no continuing costs associated with the acceptance of this donation. At the meeting held on April 19, 2016, your Public Safety Committee considered this matter. An opportunity for public comment was held. After a brief discussion, the Committee recommended that Council approve the donation of building materials and labor for the benefit of the LAPD, Devonshire Area, as recommended by the Board of Police Commissioners, as detailed above. This matter is now forwarded to the Council for its consideration.
