1	8/9/2017	Jumper Cable, Battery	Used standard batter jumper cables. Items will be used by the Mobile Command Response Unit to service dead batteries in tractors and trucks. Heavily used but serviceable.
2	8/22/2017	Belt, High Visibility	Reflective nylon and plastic belt. Items will be used by the Mobile Command Response Unit during deployment of heavy equipment during dark environments where safety and visibility are required. Items are in used condition.
3	8/22/2017	Gloves, Fuel Handler, JP-8	Utility gloves used to protect hands during fueling. Items will be used by the Mobile Command Response Unit and Air Support Unit to handle diesel and jet fuels. Items are in good condition.
4	8/22/2017	Shirt, Cold Weather	Polyester thermal shirt. Items will be used in the Mobile Command Response Unit as grease rags during routine maintenance and operations of heavy equipment. Items are in heavily used condition.
