RULES, ELECTIONS, INTERGOVERNMENTAL RELATIONS, AND NEIGHBORHOODS COMMITTEE REPORT relative to a proposed ballot measure regarding Los Angeles Airport Police enrollment in the Los Angeles Fire and Police Pension (LAFPP) Plan and the actuarial impact on future annual costs.

Recommendations for Council action:

- 1. REQUEST the City Attorney to draft the documents necessary to place on the ballot for the November 8, 2016 State General Election, a proposed Charter amendment to amend the LAFPP Plan to allow sworn Los Angeles Airport peace officers hired after a specified date to enroll in Tier 6 of the LAFPP Plan, allow sworn Los Angeles Airport peace officers to elect to transfer from Los Angeles City Employees' Retirement System (LACERS) to LAFPP Tier 6 and to purchase, at their own expense, retirement credit for prior City service, and to permit a Los Angeles Airport Police Chief appointed after a certain date to enroll in LACERS rather than be a member of the LAFPP Plan.
- 2. INSTRUCT the City Clerk to place the report on the first available Council agenda after the necessary documents are received from the City Attorney.

<u>Fiscal Impact Statement</u>: None submitted by the City Administrative Officer. The Chief Legislative Analyst has not completed a financial analysis of this report.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

SUMMARY

At a special meeting held on June 17, 2016, the Rules, Elections, Intergovernmental Relations, and Neighborhoods Committee considered a report from the CAO dated June 3, 2016 relative to a proposed ballot measure regarding enrollment of Los Angeles Airport Police in the LAFPP Plan, and an actuarial study of the impact of the proposed measure upon future annual costs from Segal Consulting submitted by the CAO.

After providing an opportunity for public comment, the Committee approved the recommendations in the CAO report. This matter is now forwarded to the Council for its consideration.
