

## A Resolution in Support of Exploring a Partnership: City of Los Angeles and the Los Unified School District (LAUSD) -College Savings Accounts for LAUSD Students

Whereas, The LAUSD and City of Los Angeles have a shared priority to ensure every District student has access to the financial resources necessary to thrive personally and academically through graduation from college or university; and

Whereas, June 2014 research<sup>1</sup> conducted by the Corporation for Enterprise Development<sup>2</sup> demonstrates that low-income children, with a college savings account, are four times more likely to graduate from college than those without an account; and

Whereas, The Fulfillment Fund<sup>3</sup> and other partnering District organizations have had great success building relationships with District students, leading to increased graduation and college entrance rates<sup>4</sup>; and

Whereas, students from the cities of Pittsburgh<sup>5</sup>, St. Louis<sup>6</sup>, and San Francisco<sup>7</sup> have benefitted from similar efforts, with those programs providing templates for developing a Los Angeles model; and

Whereas, in April 2016, Mayor Garcetti committed to a goal of providing every graduate of the Los Angeles Unified School District with one free year of community college starting in 2017, known as the Los Angeles College Promise proposal<sup>8</sup>; let it be

**Resolved,** that the California State University, Los Angeles Associated Students, Incorporated (A.S.I.) supports the effort to begin exploration of a (cost-neutral to LAUSD) City of Los Angeles and LAUSD partnership to expand the Los Angeles College Promise proposal to provide a college savings account for every District student, increase financial literacy among District students, and ensure college tuition is not a barrier for student access to college; and, be it finally
