CONSIDERATION

The Los Angeles Department of Aging (LADOA) requests authorization from City Council and Mayor to appropriate \$28,908 in CDBG Funds for the operation of the EARS program. The Program Year 43 funding was approved by the City Council and concurred by the Mayor (per Council File #16-1091). These funds need to be added to the Department of Aging's Fiscal Year 2016-2017 accounts. This funding is to provide the staff and expense account resources to direct the Emergency Alert Response System (EARS).

NARRATIVE

The Los Angeles Department of Aging (LADOA) requests authorization from City Council and Mayor to appropriate \$28,908 in CDBG Funds for the operation of the EARS program. The Program Year 43 funding was approved by the City Council and concurred by the Mayor (per Council File #16-1091). This funding is to provide the staff and expense account resources to direct the Emergency Alert Response System (EARS).

LADOA administers the EARS program in order to provide older adults who are age 60 or older, homebound, frail, low-income, and minority older adults to assist them to remain in their homes for as long as possible. The purpose of the EARS Program is to enable these older adults to remain in their home by providing means to contact emergency services (medical, police, fire) when necessary. Older adults participating in the EARS Program are provided a device that when activated (in case of an emergency) contacts a response center staffed 24/7 who would send the appropriate medical, police, and or fire emergency responders in the City of Los Angeles. Audio monitoring of the older adults also takes place by the staff at the response center until emergency responders arrive at the older adult's home or the situation is resolved. The EARS Program has served over 1,000 older adults per month and has been in operation since 1982.

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FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT

The proposed actions involve the appropriation of CDBG funds. There is no additional impact to the City General Fund.
