On October 26, 2015, the City Council approved a Motion (Englander – Wesson – Krekorian) committing the City of Los Angeles (the City) to host the 2017 World Police and Fire Games (WPFG) and directed the Chief Legislative Analyst (CLA), to report on actions necessary to host the event.

On December 14, 2016, a Motion was approved by the City Council that amended recommendations contained within communication from the Chief Legislative Analyst (CLA) relative to the 2017 World Police and Fire Games (WPFG) (CF 16-1159). The motion contained six recommendations (Addendum 1). It was requested that the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) report back on Recommendations 5 and 6.

Recommendation 5: Direct the LAPD to report on issues related to providing computer equipment for event registration and hosting WPFG information on LAPD servers;

Response: The California Athletic Federation will provide computer equipment for the registration process. There are no associated costs with obtaining the equipment and the LAPD server will not be used. The server, which is registered to the California Athletic Federation, will be cloud based.

Recommendation 6. DIRECT the LAPD and Los Angeles Fire Department (LAFD) to report, prior to the opening ceremonies, on the personnel and associated costs to provide adequate security and medical coverage for events within the City.

Response: The LAPD will be responsible for the security plan and LAFD for the medical, pertaining to events held within the City. The estimated expenditures for security and medical personnel are a direct salary cost of LAPD and LAFD.

The security plan is currently under development and it is anticipated that personnel will be deployed over 24 operational periods. An operational period consists of an 8 or 10-hour detail. Based on current assessments, approximately 9,966 hours at an average hourly rate of \$55.00 will be expended; totaling an expected cost of \$548,130 for security staff.

Medical doctors required for events will be compensated by the WPFG, at no cost to the City. Medical professionals (Emergency Medical Technicians) have also been obtained on a voluntary basis via WPFG volunteer efforts. LAFD will respond to requests for service on an as-needed basis.

- 5. DIRECT the LAPD to report on issues related to providing computer equipment for event registration and hosting WPFG information on LAPD servers; and

6. DIRECT the LAPD and LAFD to report, prior to the opening ceremonies, on the personnel and associated costs to provide adequate security and medical coverage for events within the City of Los Angeles.
