**DRAFT ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTIONS 66.33 THROUGH 66.33.10 OF THE  
LOS ANGELES MUNICIPAL CODE RELATING TO THE COLLECTION OF SOLID  
WASTE FROM COMMERCIAL ESTABLISHMENTS AND  
MULTIFAMILY DWELLINGS**

Honorable Members:

Pursuant to your request on November 23, 2016, this Office has prepared and now transmits for your consideration the enclosed draft ordinance, approved as to form and legality. The draft ordinance amends Sections 66.33 through 66.33.10 of Chapter VI, Article 6 of the Los Angeles Municipal Code relating to the collection of solid waste from commercial establishments and multifamily dwellings, and adds reporting requirements regarding use of subcontractors and identification of additional subcontracting opportunities by franchisees in the exclusive franchise system. The draft ordinance formalizes the process for addition of subcontractors (Minority Business Enterprises, Women Business Enterprises, Other Business Enterprises, Emerging Business Enterprises, Disabled Veterans Business Enterprises, and Small Business Enterprises); additions of subcontractors to the franchise agreements are subject to prior approval by the City of Los Angeles (City). The draft ordinance also conditions the City's exercise of an option to renew franchise agreements on a franchisee's compliance with the subcontractor related reporting requirements and efforts to mentor subcontractors and additional subcontractor outreach performed.

CEQA Findings

If the subject ordinance is enacted, the City Council should determine the adoption of this ordinance is exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) under Article 18, Section 15060 (c)(2) of the State CEQA Guidelines and Article II, Section 2(m) of the City CEQA Guidelines.
