Esteemed Plum Committee,

Today's decision could potentially affect my life in profound ways. Let me please briefly introduce myself.

My name is Anthony Shogren and I have been a music professional in this city since February 2, 1986. At age 20 I arrived here in Los Angeles both bright eyed and bushy-tailed with tremendous amount of education, talent, and experience. From my years of performance with Sambaguru to Sergio Mendes and Brasil 2000 to my formal education as a Sally Cassanova predoctoral scholar in 2008-09 at CSU Los Angeles, I feel my artistic and cultural contribution to the city of Los Angeles has been codified through awards, hundreds of recordings, thousands of concerts, as well as the respect of my peers.

The sad truth of both the trials of the music industry and struggles of our collective economy, have left a few options for artist like me in terms of healthy longevity and affordable housing.

Today's ruling in adding language to legally permit movable tiny houses as ADU's is crucial as a potential for personal long term self sustainability. This, for the very first time, would make possible a means of housing beyond gentrification, city fiscal impact, and a potential housing bubble to run out of control as seen in 2008 and 2009. As a society we must find alternative options beyond urban sprawl and land development by big business.

This ruling would allow for personal ownership of a healthy long-term housing option beyond leasing and an increasingly dilapidated residential landscape.

There is also a consideration of an altruistic sustainable alternative to constant consumption and an increase of strain on resources. Moveable tiny house options as ADU's, represent a potential decrease in water consumption, electrical needs and strains on the municipal electric power supply, and less general waste.

If this committee wishes to find a citizenry capable of pulling itself up by its proverbial bootstraps, then I urge you all to consider this legislation with great care.
